I. INTRODUCTION

Congratulations on your achievements in scouts and thank you for considering Montgomery Township as the place to complete your Eagle Scout leadership service project or Girl Scout Gold Award. The Township Committee greatly appreciates the contributions that the Boy and Girl Scouts have made throughout the Township and we look forward to your proposal. The following guidelines and background information are intended to help you understand the process involved with a Leadership Project on municipal property and includes a list of approved project ideas.

Municipal Representative

A Municipal Representative (staff or member of a board, committee or commission) has been assigned to each project. The projects are listed later in the guidelines.

Support of Your Troop

The Township expects each scout to have the full support and supervision of their troop leaders and project advisor.

Approval by Township Committee

Scouts who select a Leadership Project that will take place on municipal property must obtain approval by the group of elected officials who govern the Township, known as the Township Committee. This is in addition to the various approvals that are required by your scout leaders and council.

The Township Committee relies on volunteer committees and municipal staff to advise scouts in the development and implementation of their project.

II. PROJECT LIST

The Township has developed a list of projects covering a wide-range of topics including public health and safety, recreation and the environment.

- Scouts may propose an idea that does not appear on this list, but if it is not a project
 that the Township can accommodate at that time, then the scout will be asked to select a
 project from the list.

Come up with an idea for an activity or event that you would organize and carry-out (e.g. program on bike safety) at the Montgomery Township Summer Camp.

Mill Pond Soccer Field Signs

Create new signs for the soccer fields at Mill Pond Park that label all 7 fields for easy reference (Field #1, Field #2, etc.). New signs should also include a provision for noting if fields are open or closed.

Van Horne Park Kiosk

There are two existing wooden kiosk frames at Van Horne Park that could use refurbishment (e.g. sanding, water seal). The Scout would also research and create interpretive signage to add to the kiosk, such as information about birds & bats that live/hunt in the open meadow areas; Lyme Disease awareness; responsible recreation, etc.

Back to Tap

Encourage residents to reduce the number of disposable water bottles used and thrown into the trash in Montgomery. Ask residents to switch from bottled water to tap water, to use reusable water bottles when possible and to recycle. Publicize the quality of tap water (Elizabethtown/NJ American Water can provide data). Educate residents on health reusable bottles, for example, plastic BPA-free bottles, stainless steel and glass. The winning design will be shown on the municipality's website or social media site, if practical.

Project ideas from the Millstone Valley Preservation Coalition

• Recording oral histories

The Coalition is interested in gathering oral histories from long-time residents, families that have lived in the area for several generations, local historians, and others. These people have interesting and relevant historical knowledge and stories that may not be recorded elsewhere. By collecting this information, their knowledge will be preserved.

• Docent at the Bridgetender's House

The Bridgetender's House has been restored and serves as the Visitor Center for the Millstone Valley Scenic Byway. Volunteers are needed on the weekends, starting in the spring and running until Thanksgiving to serve as docents. By volunteering, you'll need to become familiar with the history of the region, the D&R Canal and much more.

• Vegetable Garden

Volunteers are needed to construct raised planting beds at the Bridgetender's House. The Scout can then seek donations from nurseries and residents for materials to plant in the garden. The Scout could create a historically-accurate vegetable garden from the Dutch Colonial time period that would have provided for the household.
