6. RESOLUTION #12-12- 241 - PROPRIETARY DESIGNATION FOR THE MEMBRANE REPLACEMENT SUPPLY EQUIPMENT AT PIKE BROOK WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT BID

WHEREAS, the Township of Montgomery has a need to replace membrane equipment at the Pike Brook Wastewater Treatment Plant (WTP); and

WHEREAS, the Township utilizes a membrane filtration system that has a number of modules that make up the filtration unit; and

WHEREAS, the modular nature of these units makes it extremely difficult, if not impossible, to use any other equipment in the system interfaces and design as constructed, designed, and provided by Zenon Environmental Corporation; and

WHEREAS, Zenon Environmental Corporation, 4636 Somerton Road, Trevose, PA 19053 is the design and manufacturing provider of the filtration components at the Pike Brook WTP; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Administrative Code, as a supplement and direction for the New Jersey Local Public Contracts Law of N.J.A.C. 5:34-9.1, defines proprietary as "Specialized nature" and means the purpose to which the goods or services will be used has such unique characteristics only the goods or services of a single vendor are capable of meeting the contracting unit's needs"; and

WHEREAS, the use of a good or service other than the proprietary one will undermine the functionality or operational performance of existing facilities; and

WHEREAS, the filtration at the Pike Brook WTP is necessary for the conduct of its affairs, meaning the public need for the proprietary designation is of such a compelling nature the value to the public that is gained by the proprietary designation overshadows the public benefit of permitting "brand name or equivalent" and the benefits of such competition; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Montgomery has a substantial investment in facilities, training, replacement parts, or complimentary items that warrants reliance on a specific manufacturer or vendor to maintain the value of the investment; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:34-9.1(b), the Governing Body of the Township of Montgomery prior to advertising for the receipt of bids that includes proprietary goods or services, has received the resolution of proprietary bid and recommended by the Qualified Purchasing Agent; and

WHEREAS, this resolution shall become part of any bid for replacement of filtration equipment at the Pike Brook WTP.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Montgomery that the proprietary designation for the bid of membrane filtrations equipment and accessories is deemed to be in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:34-9.1 and will become a part of any future bid for replacement of the system at the Pike Brook Wastewater Treatment Plant.

9. RESOLUTION 22-12-248 - AUTHORIZING SETTLEMENT OF LITIGATION IN GREENHOUSE VS. MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP MATTER

WHEREAS, on or about April 1, 2019, plaintiff, Daniel Greenhouse ("Plaintiff"), instituted an action in the Superior Court of New Jersey entitled *Daniel Greenhouse vs. Township of Montgomery*, Docket No. SOM-L-424-19, challenging the Township's extension of an agricultural lease on certain municipally owned open space property designated as Lots 5 and 5.01 in Block 29001 on the Montgomery Township Tax Map; and

WHEREAS, by Opinion and Order entered by the court on March 31, 2020, the court entered judgment in favor of the Township; and

WHEREAS, Plaintiff appealed the court's March 31, 2020 Order, and by decision entered on September 9, 2022, the Appellate Division vacated the trial court's March 31, 2020 Order and remanded the matter back to the trial court for further proceedings; and

WHEREAS, following the remand, Plaintiff and the Township (collectively, the "Parties") have worked collaboratively to address and amicably resolve the matters pending between them, and now desire to enter into a Consent Order of Settlement and Dismissal to resolve the pending litigation; and

WHEREAS, settlement of the litigation presents an opportunity to resolve the various matters pending between the Parties, will result in cost savings and other benefits to the Parties, serve not only the interests of the Parties, but also the interests of the general public as well.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Montgomery, County of Somerset, New Jersey, as follows:

- The preamble to this Resolution is hereby incorporated as if more fully set forth herein.
- 2.
